Board Meeting Highlights

The Board of Directors of the Optimist Club of Greater Vienna met **January 13, 2021**, via Zoom teleconference. All members were present. Among the business conducted was the following:

- Treasurer noted receipt of \$1000 grant from Navy Federal Credit Union;
- Treasurer reported that sales taxes on Christmas tree sales have been remitted to the state, and that the filing was greatly simplified by the use of the Square terminal on the lot;
- Farmers Market committee reported that same pandemic precautions as last year will be in effect for 2021, per Town of Vienna rep; we have a shopping bag sponsor; other local businesses also interested in sponsoring the Market;
- Youth VP and Director reported on status of winter/spring contests and awards, and membership in JOI Clubs;
- Membership VP and Director reported on anonymous gift to defray dues for new members
- President proposed new initiative, "Belong!", to pair students at Cunningham Park ES with tutors;
- President presented revised calendar with one general meeting and one board meeting per month while virtual meetings continue.

The Board of Directors of the Optimist Club of Greater Vienna met **February 10, 2021**, via Zoom teleconference. One member was absent.

Among the business conducted was the following:

- Treasurer reported that Club dues and sponsored JOI Club dues have been paid to OI;
- Board approved increase of Helping Hands Awards to schools from \$200 to \$300;
- President reported virtual meeting for wine tasting was a success; next social meeting may be a game night; other suggestions welcomed;
- Board approved Tim C. for membership;
- Board discussed propriety of OI's choice of venue for Junior Golf Tournament;
- Youth Director reported five Marshall HS students have interviewed to be tutors for "Belong!".

By email vote following the meeting, Board approved revising the number of Investment Committee members from six to three (members to be: President, Treasurer, one non-Board Club member with professional finance experience).
